



## An Unexact Science

Curt Baker, 56; his wife Ann, 44, have two children--Roy, 19, a full-time college student, and Meg, 4. The couple owns their own home, which they refinanced this year.

Ann switched jobs and made \$80,900 and inherited \$30,500. Curt made \$30,831 in Schedule C income and also received a \$60,000 lump-sum payout from his 401(k) when he retired. The Bakers' investments include a mix of stocks, bonds and mutual funds totaling \$21,298 in interest, dividends and capital gains.

Money Magazine and USA Today ran separate surveys of 45 tax professionals asking for the tax liability of a hypothetical US family.

These 45 tax professionals gave 45 different tax liabilities <u>ranging from \$36,322 to \$94,438.</u>







## **Automating Ethics**



Is using ChatGPT cheating?



Using ChatGPT, or any other language model or tool for generating text, is not necessarily cheating. However, it is important to use these tools responsibly and to proper credit any generated text that you use in your own work.

If you are using ChatGPT or similar tools for academic or professional work, it is follow proper citation and attribution guidelines. This typically means citing the source in your work and including a disclaimer stating that the generated text is own original work.

In general, it is always important to be honest and transparent about your use c or resources in your work, and to give credit where it is due.

#### III. AI Policy

I expect you to use AI (ChatGPT and image generation tools, at a minimum), in this class. In fact, some assignments will require it. Learning to use AI is an emerging skill, and I provide tutorials in Canvas about how to use them. I am happy to meet and help with these tools during office hours or after class.

Be aware of the limits of ChatGPT:

- If you provide minimum effort prompts, you will get low quality results. You will need to refine your prompts in order to get good outcomes. This will take work.
- Don't trust anything it says. If it gives you a number or fact, assume it is wrong unless you either know the answer or can check in with another source. You will be responsible for any errors or omissions provided by the tool. It works best for topics you understand.
- AI is a tool, but one that you need to acknowledge using. Please include a paragraph at the end of any assignment that uses AI explaining what you used the AI for and what prompts you used to get the results. Failure to do so is in violation of academic honesty policies.
- Be thoughtful about when this tool is useful. Don't use it if it isn't appropriate for the case or circumstance.
